This permit is issued subject to the directions, restrictions, and conditions contained herein and on the reverse of this form and any attachments hereto, and covers only the work described in this application, and then only when the work is performed as directed. Violations are subject to the penalties set forth in Title 19, Section 43, V.S.A. of fines of not less than \$100, nor more than \$10,000 for each violation.
